Improving Safety in the Supply Chain through Operational and Business Excellence

Operational Excellence Frameworks and Management Systems have in the past few years helped create opportunities for greater collaboration between departments in companies and greater collaboration between companies within a supply chain. From an internal context, operational excellence provides for processes to be established within organizations which help procurement, operations and safety functions work closely with each other in the setting of efficient processes that ensure that safe and reliable products and services are procured.

From an external context, working through collaborative networks which avoid conflict of competing commercial interests, can mean that better systems, products and services can be developed. The experience and knowledge sharing through using effective communications of practice in OE can be significant.

This short presentation will talk about the 7 fundamentals of operationally excellent organizations and will give examples of how OE can help in the overall improvement in safety in the supply chains.

Guarding against fraud and counterfeit products

Beyond knock-off luxury handbags and watches, counterfeit products have found their way into almost every sector including: Aerospace, Nuclear, Defence, Automotive, Pharmaceutical, Electronics, Safety Equipment, Personal Protective Equipment, Media, Food and Beverage and Toys. Fraudulent products can pose significant safety hazards and can cause deaths, injuries, and substantial property loss, if left undetected. Legitimate branded products cost significantly more because they are designed and tested to comply with safety and regulatory requirements. Global on-line trading opportunities have created and encouraged the growth of counterfeit goods and the theft of companies' intellectual property. Improving supply chain security, anti-counterfeiting technologies and Blockchain are important measures to combat counterfeit products.


